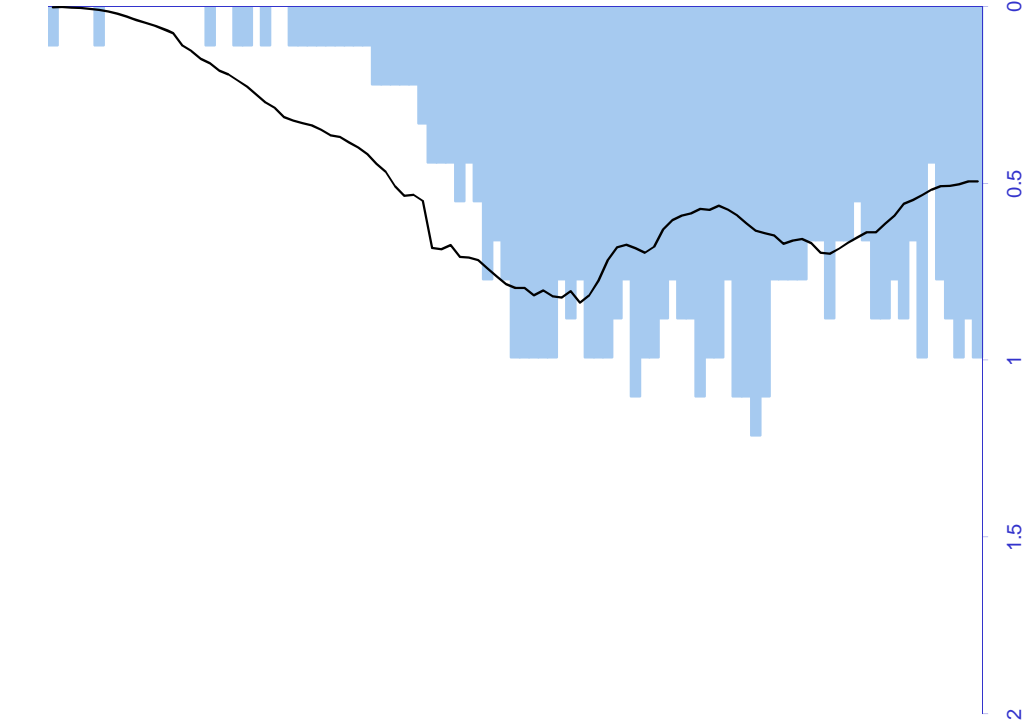

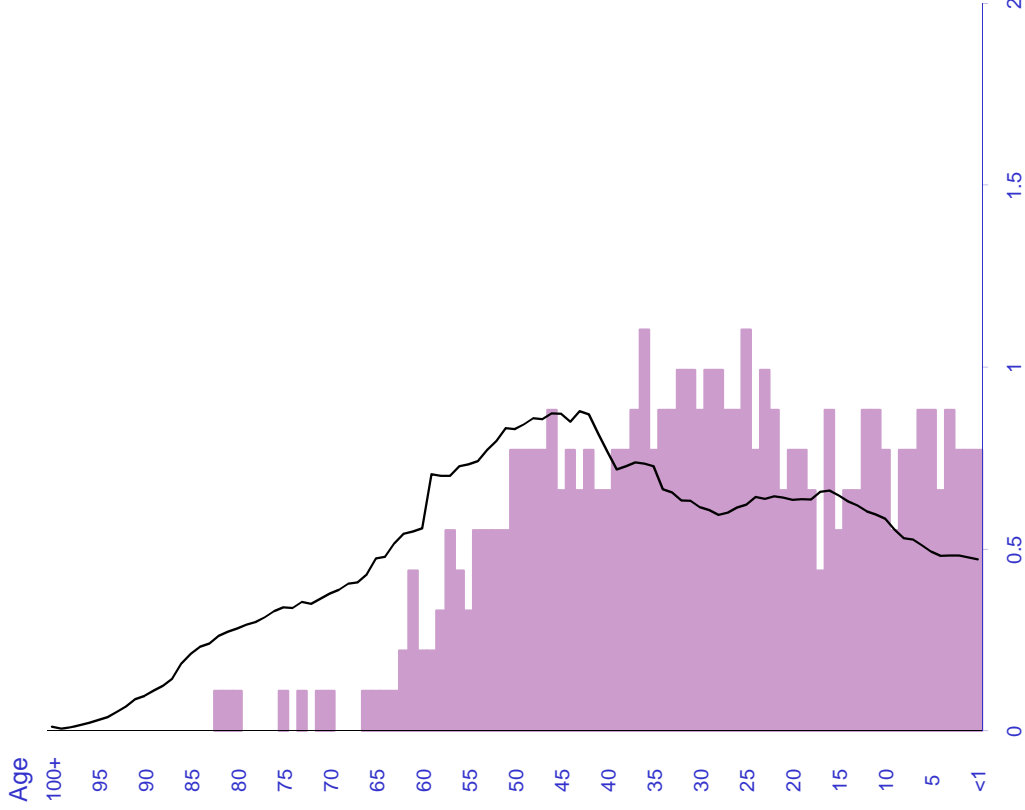

2,385 Males, median age 30.9; (BC median 40.0)



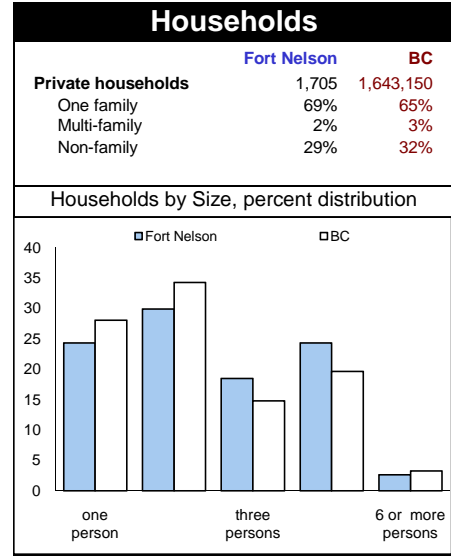
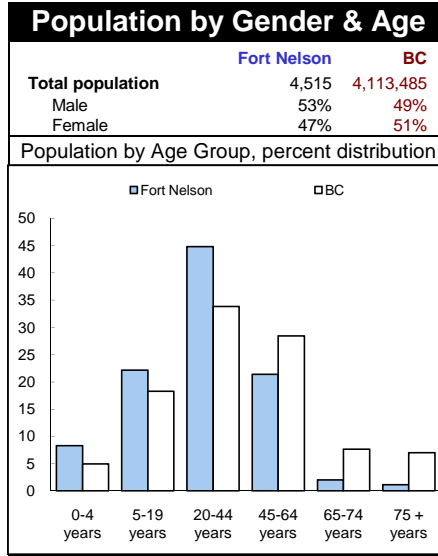

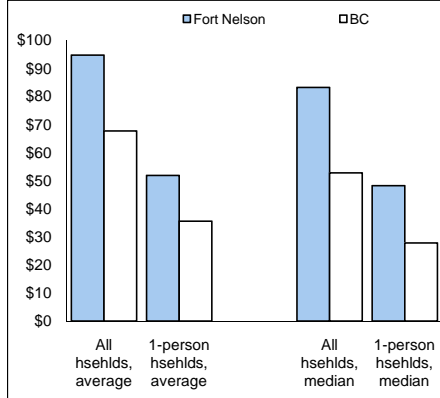

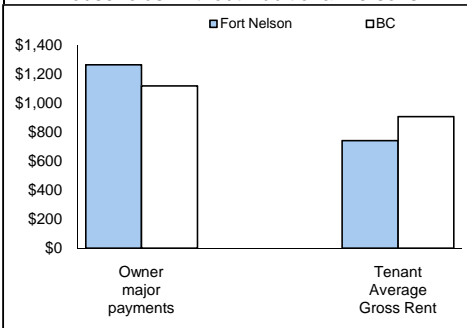
2005 Before-tax Household Income (\$,000)
